

Church in focus

ST. ANDREW'S, DARTFORD

At a conference on the subject of 'Praying in the Spirit' a warning was given. 'Be careful what you pray for, you might get it!'. Church in Focus 2018. I shared a visionary word that we, a small ageing congregation received twelve years previously. "That we would double in number" we had changed considerably, we had young families and children and were giving thanks for our growth. We felt that it was a start, but not fruition of the vision given. Turning to the word it instructs us in James 1: 5 'if you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you'. The way we needed to pray was in the next verse. 'But when you ask be sure that your faith is in God. In faith we continued to pray. Today we have completed our Annual Returns 76 Adults of all ages and 26 children, more than double. Over the past two years, God has brought to us preachers, teachers and musicians, gifts prayed for. The pandemic has not separated us, it's united us. We have found that a people that sincerely 'Pray and Worship Together' unite Together'.
